Harmonium was published during an era of intense turmoil, as Joseph Riddell remarks in his article Wallace Stevens' Ideas of Order: The Rhetoric of Politics and The Rhetoric of Poetry, "Somewhere between 1918 and 1930= the world fell apart... " (328). 1923 represents a year where the consequences of World War I were still fresh, and the impending disaster of the Great Depression was lurking on the horizon. This is perhaps the root of Stevens' urge to live in = the imagination.
